# THINKING


## Maths at St. Aldhelm's

At St. Aldhelm's all children take part in carefully planned maths activities every day in class, to develop their skills and knowledge of fluency, reasoning and problem solving in maths. However, on Wednesday 17th October, the whole school enjoyed a one-off Maths Problem Solving Morning where every child faced a similar problem to explore and investigate. They worked independently and collaboratively, drawing on a wide variety of resources and methods. They recorded their findings in creative and imaginative ways demonstrating their mathematical thinking and understanding. We were impressed by the participation, determination and application that went on. Thank you Mrs Phillips, our school Maths Subject Lead, for planning and coordinating this event.






In Woodpeckers, Mrs Newman was really impressed with how Year 5 first selected resources that would help them and even constructed resources to work through their problem. The children used thought clouds to capture their thinking at different stages. Will inspired others to construct an abacus. Jack created a theory about a rule and went on to investigate this. He was able to create a rule and prove it. Sophie asked for further resources that she thought of to support her with the challenge.











Reception Robins Fred the Farmer has harvested some red and green apples. He needs to box up the apples, in rows of 3, to send to Robin Café. The Farmer has been asked to put the apples into the boxes in as many different ways as he can. How many different ways can you pack the boxes to help Farmer Fred?



Blackbirds worked collaboratively and with increasing levels of systematical thinking and recording. Due to the nature of the numbers they were using the conclusion reached was that there were many more possibilities than they were first anticipating.























Finches explored the problem, investigated and found lots of possibilities. They used reflection bubbles to share their thinking and reasoning.















Magpies showed terrific concentration and perseverance in solving the problem. They really considered, explained and reasoned how they knew they had found all the possibilities. Mrs Philips shared individual children's recordings on the whole class whiteboard and they worked out what each other had done.










We encourage lots of maths activities at home to support number, reasoning and problem solving knowledge and skills. Board games, card games and games online are a fun way to learn and help your child.

Thank you to everyone who supported the Wizards and Witches Disco. This was a great success with terrific turnout and lots of fun for the children. We raised a grand total of £279.46 - thank you. We appreciate the contributions you make as they let us support the school in providing opportunities, resources and experiences for the children. Monies from this event will fund exciting treats for all children this Christmas. There have been requests for another disco – watch this space later in the academic year.

Due to unforeseen circumstances the PTA AGM was cancelled. Each year the Committee is reformed according to PTA Commission rules. This means that Post-holders need to be elected annually by the members of the PTA. This is usually done at an AGM in order that 'quorum' is reached - this is another rule whereby a minimum of 10% of the members are present to sign off the committee. #### St. Aldhelm's Governors

#### Governor news:

After nearly 40 years of loving and dedicated service to our school, Joy Lees' final term of office as a governor came to an end last month. Some of you will remember her from your own days as pupils at the school and I hope you will share those memories if you happen to see Joy around school or in the village. At our celebration assembly on Thursday the children said a heartfelt thank you to Joy for all she has done for so many children over the years. I'm delighted to tell you that Joy will still be involved with the school in future but in a different role, as she continues to be a great example of how to live out our core school values by developing links between school, church and village.

Revd Jonathan has also had to stand down as ex-officio governor. (Ex-officio just means that his role as vicar entitles him to be a governor of the school.) We are fortunate to have Patricia Hillier to act in this capacity with Jonathan's approval. Patricia has already started working with us; she will have a particular responsibility for Collective Worship, RE and church school ethos. Alison Mann has also joined this term as a Foundation Governor – she will be taking over as link governor for SEN+D.

You may remember that after comments in the parents' questionnaire, governors set up a working party to look at communications. This term a group of governors and Mrs Cohen started work on the challenge of researching what's needed by the school and what parents want from the school in terms of improving communication. We've already identified that the school website needs a new fresh approach with better information for all but this will not be a 'quick fix' and will need research and consultation if we are to achieve the best that is possible for everyone. All this will take time. As part of the consultation process, we'd like to survey parents for their opinions on the methods and frequency of communication from the school. We're asking for input from parents and carers, so please look out for the survey next term and share your thoughts.

Unseen progress is being made on the outdoor classroom in terms of design and building and we hope you will see something tangible in the Spring term.

The format of news and information from school is under review as part of our wider commitment to make communication as effective and user-friendly as possible so there is no separate Governor Newsletter this term. Watch this space!
