





Year 4 Trip to 'The Museum of Somerset'

Year 4 had a great trip to The Museum of Somerset in Taunton on Tuesday 28th February. First, we enjoyed sharing all of our Roman knowledge. Our guide was very impressed with everything we knew already. After that we dressed up roman armour, togas and poor slave clothes.







Then we had the opportunity to handle some roman artefacts. We worked as real archaeologists to try and identify what each item was, what it was made out of and what it would have been used for. Our particular favourites were the razors, bowl and roofing tile.



After lunch, we then explored the museum further. Some of our highlights were the huge roman mosaic from Low Ham Villa, all the different brooches like one Boudica might have worn. We also enjoyed finding out about the large collection of roman coins and the skeleton of the roman lady and her dog.

YEAR 3 EGYPTIAN VISIT



We completed a lot of activities. For one, we created a scarab amulet that we could take home. These were like good luck charms to the Egyptians. We could paint them using red, blue, green and yellow. Each colour had a special symbolic reference to the Egyptians.



We became archaeologists and had to dig through sand to find ancient artefacts!

We looked at papyrus, paper made from plants.

PERSONAL SAFETY WEEK

During Personal Safety Week, classes looked at different aspects of keeping themselves safe. From hazards, risks and dangers in the home and school, to safety out and about on the roads and in public places, to awareness and rules around water, to knowing about healthy and safe relationships. All involved identifying strategies to be safe and looking at the work of the emergency services too. Read on for some specific class activities:



For personal safety week, Year 4 focused on keeping safe outdoors. We began by exploring our school grounds identifying potential hazards, risks and dangers then how we could minimise these. After that, we thought about keeping safe around water. The children were all very knowledgeable and shared lots of sensible ideas. We worked in groups to present our personal safety top tips in a creative way.



As part of our Police project in YR, we have been talking about staying safe inside and outside school. We have been reading the story 'We are gentle... we don't hurt others'. Using examples from the story the children have demonstrated positive ways of staying safe in our play in and outside the classroom.



Children in Year 3 looked at healthy friendships and relationships during Personal Safety Week. We explored our rights and responsibilities and did a lot of investigative work into how our actions may affect others.











We investigated risks, hazards and dangers in the home.









Year 5 Personal Safety Week

Year 5 were so interested in the Road Safety assembly we took part in, that they wanted to create posters to help remind people about how to be safe. All this work has been put into a display in our classroom.



In Year 6, we explored how to stay safe online, in particular within the online gaming community. We started the week by looking at what PEGI ratings mean and why they might be important. The children showed a good understanding of the ratings and were able to articulate why different games may not be suitable for all. As the safety week progressed, we explored why it is important to stay safe online and how to do so.

Year 6 looked at real case studies of different experiences of children online. Year 6 explored what we would do if someone we didn't know tried to persuade us to meet up or do something they weren't comfortable with. The children identified the following actions they would take:












- Tell a trusted adult if someone you don't know tries to persuade you to meet up, requests information including pictures, acts in an inappropriate way or says inappropriate things
- Do not accept friend requests from anyone you do not know in person
- If you have already accepted a request, you can always block someone

We were very impressed with the mature approach of Year 6 in addressing a difficult topic and their ideas on what they should do if any potentially dangerous situations arise while they are online.



On a very cold and muddy Tuesday afternoon, 9 runners from St Aldhelm's headed to Millfield to compete in the Mendip School's Cross Country Race. All the runners showed great resilience and perseverance through the extremely tough conditions. We had runners in all four events. Lola G in lower school girls, Alfie, Corey and Jamie lower school boys, Freya B, Freya E and Katherine upper school girls and Harry G and Finley upper school boys. It was fantastic to see the children cheering on their team mates showing such amazing team spirit. The children should be extremely proud of themselves and their achievements.
